

Installation of GiAPA



GiAPA can be downloaded from www.giapa.com → Downloads → New Installation

Our software can be downloaded online as a zipped file named **giapa.zip**. This password-protected file can be unzipped on your PC by obtaining the required password from your GiAPA sales representative. The zipped file consists of a save file **giapalib.savf**, which contains the library GIAPALIB, and the file **GiAPAmmanual.pdf**.

You must transfer **giapalib.savf** once you have unzipped the file to an already existing *SAVF on your iSeries (if you use FTP: Remember BINary mode).

To install, sign on using a profile having QSECOFR authority and with the system value QALWOBJRST allowing a restore of programs using adopted authority followed by the command
RSTLIB SAVLIB(GIAPALIB) DEV(*SAVF) SAVF(mysavefile).

Adopted authority is used because QACGJRN *JRN and the performance collector APIs QPMLPFRD and QPMWKCOL are shipped with public authority *EXCLUDE. GiAPA's data collection programs GIAPA111, GIAPA112 and GIAPA113 are therefore shipped with authority adopted from QSECOFR. GiAPA may be restored using profiles with less authority, but the data collection must in this case be made under user profiles having authority to call QPMLPFRD and QPMWKCOL and to read the job accounting journal. GiAPA Menu option 89 can be used to check if a user profile has the authorization needed for data collection.

To start data collection use either

- GiAPA menu option 11 (get the menu by using command **GIAPALIB/GIAPA**), or
- command **GIAPALIB/GIAPA110**

Most likely all the standard values of the command can be used and no changes of parameters should be necessary. However, you are of course welcome to refer to the user manual for various options.

When starting GiAPA you may use keyword MINUTES within command GIAPA110 to specify a collection time limit. If you leave the default value *NOMAX value unchanged, GiAPA will continue running, and restart every midnight. To terminate the data collection please use:

- GiAPA menu option 13 or
- command **GIAPALIB/GIAPA130 TERMINATE(Y)**

The data collection requires no software security code, and will typically use less than 0.1% CPU.

Note that you will only be able to analyze the data collected (GiAPA Menu option 14) if you have received a valid security code (installed using command GIAPALIB/GIAPA009).

Important: Backup of GIAPALIB

Please note that if GIAPALIB is backed up using "save while active" during performance data collection you should specify **OMITOBJ((GIAPALIB/*ALL *USRSPC) (GIAPALIB/GIAPA115* *USRIDX))** for the backup run in order to avoid abnormal termination of the GiAPA jobs.

Is GiAPA Data Collection Active?

Look for job names prefixed with "GIAPA" in the QSYSWRK subsystem. Only job GIAPAPFCOL will have an opened output file. If HotSpots are collected, there will be some GIAPAHOTSP jobs.

To get an impression of the amount of data collected from GiAPA Menu option 81 choose selection 5 to obtain the statistics for the different collection record types.

***MGTCOL objects**

GiAPA receives performance data from the IBM Performance Collector APIs every 15 seconds. These APIs also generate *MGTCOL objects with attribute *PFR. These objects are not used by GiAPA. The disk space they occupy can be seen by using command **DSPOBJD OBJ(*ALL/*ALL) OBJTYPE(*MGTCOL)**. "Configuration and Services" in iSeries Navigator or CL-command **CFGPFRCOL** can be used to specify how long time *MGTCOL objects are retained on the system (default is 24 hours).
